The Women's Health Clinical Research Center (WHCRC) under the leadership of the Vice-chair for Clinical Research, Dr. Barnhart, can help with the design and conduct of clinical research studies. Specifically, the WHCRC staff can provide assistance with:

- Communication with regulatory offices within the University including Office of Regulatory Affairs and Office of Human Research
- IRB preparation, continuing renewals, amendments and adverse event reporting
- Setting up a study binder and need for study monitoring
- · Biostatistical support for pilot or investigator initiated projects
- Study design and feasibility
- Identifying research opportunities
- Submission of grant applications
- Budgets
- Recruitment of research personnel

Center for Research and Reproduction and Women's Health (CRRWH)

The CRRWH administrative staff resides on the 13th floor of the Biomedical Research Building (BRB II/III) and is available to provide assistance with grant submissions and budgets. The staff, under the direction of Bill Stauffer, also manages our grant portfolios. The Vice-chair for Translational Research, Dr. Elovitz, is available to assist with:

- Study design
- Supervision and oversight as needed
- · Identify collaborators and opportunities for translational research
- Preparation of internal and external grant submissions
- Setting up protocols and processes for biospecimens collection and processing
- Biobanking opportunities to assist with collection to train others on established protocols and to help assist in setting up biobanks in other programs

There are a number of opportunities in the department to apply for funding for pilot grants (see below). We also encourage our fellows to consider applying for extramural funding opportunities offered by our professional organizations (i.e. ACOG, ASRM, SMFM, AUGS, etc.). We recommend you review this with one of the vice-chairs for research, research program director or research mentor in advance to assist you with writing a competitive application. These proposals must be submitted through the CRRWH and in many cases require a letter of support from the chair. Requests for divisional or departmental support for research are considered on a case-by-case basis; to apply please submit a brief proposal and description of the study, budget and budget justification to the research program director and/or departmental chair.

The George and Emily McMichael Harrison Fund

This fund was established to promote promising research in obstetrics and gynecology within the University of Pennsylvania Health System. This fund supports one to two clinical and translational research projects a year with a budget up to \$45,000. The grant is open to faculty and trainees to accelerate the pace of research and provide pilot data for larger grants and career development. Request for applications are sent in January or February with a deadline for submission of April 1st.

March of Dimes Prematurity Research Center Pilot grants

The Pilot Project Program is aimed at funding new directions in spontaneous preterm birth research. Pilot Projects can be used to fund collaborative research that may become a component of a multi-investigator award, the development of technologies that may benefit other Center investigators, and to take the Center into new directions. The Pilot Project Program serves to attract junior investigators and established faculty new to preterm birth research to the Center. Bench Research

The Department has high quality research space with adjacent offices for investigators on the 12th and 13th floors of the Biomedical Research Building (BRB) in the CRRWH (16,235 net square feet). The investigators share common space for tissue culture, animal work, microscopy, etc.

Clinical Research

Clinical research space is integrated into our clinical practices wherever possible. This model facilitates clinical research and recruitment of study participants. We also have designated clinical research units for Maternal Child Health on Silverstein 2, Gynecologic Oncology on PCAM 3, and Reproduction and the Women's Health Clinical Research Center at 3701 Market Street, 8th floor. As new clinical space becomes available, each program will have designated clinical research space.

ANNUAL RESEARCH EVENTS

Resident Research Day

The chief residents and residents who have completed their research project present their findings to the department each spring. The PGY-2 residents present their project proposals followed by the John Rock lecture by a visiting professor.

CRRWH Research Symposium and Cuozzo Lecture

The Center encourages postdoctoral fellows, clinical fellows, residents and students to present their research at an annual research symposium. Abstracts are submitted in advance and will be selected for either an oral or poster presentation, followed by the annual Cuozzo lecture by an invited professor.

March of Dimes Prematurity Research Center Retreat

The Center hosts an annual research retreat with presentations and discussion by funded investigators who are working to identify the causes of preterm birth. The retreat is open to members of the Penn community.
