If the lot at the Steamship Authority's terminal in Woods Hole is full, additional parking is available at three off-site lots in Bourne and Falmouth. Shuttle service is provided to the ticket terminal and ferry dock. Please allow extra time for this in your travel plans.

FERRY SERVICE

Passenger and car ferries to Martha's Vineyard depart from Woods Hole in Falmouth, MA. The slots for vehicles fill up quickly. The Steamship Authority will begin accepting reservation requests in early February 2022. Please check our website in early November 2021 for more information.
