Target Audience and Course Overview

The 2012 Fall Symposium presented by Penn's Center for Human Appearance highlights the principles of multidisciplinary facial reconstruction. The sharing of knowledge via interdisciplinary patient care allows for collaboration, collegiality, and the development of a broader and more sophisticated skill set. Detailed and comprehensive facial reconstructive and aesthetic principles and procedures will be covered by renowned speakers from plastic surgery, dermatology, oculoplastic surgery, otorhinolaryngology, oral and maxillofacial surgery, and psychology. Through lectures, panel discussions, videos, and cadaveric dissection, course participants will reinforce well-established reconstructive concepts, learn about recent advances such as composite tissue allotransplantation, and gain the ability to critically question dogma related to facial reconstruction. (Cadaveric dissection session offered to a limited number of course participants.)

Course Objectives

Upon completion of the program, participants should be able to:

- Summarize essential principles associated with facial reconstruction and implement them in cases related to trauma, tumor extirpation, congenital deformity and aesthetic rejuvenation
- Describe how reconstructive principles conform and differ across surgical disciplines
- Identify areas of patient care where facial reconstruction is best performed in a multidisciplinary setting
- Discuss limitations of local/regional flaps and the emerging role of composite tissue allotransplantation for facial reconstruction
- Identify areas of facial reconstruction where restoration of form and function is equally important and how to best attain both
- Describe the profound psychosocial impact of physical appearance and identify the resources available to patients
- Implement strategies for improved pre-operative consultation
- Identify applications of minimally invasive technologies on facial rejuvenation
