Course Description:

This two-day course is designed for hand and microsurgery fellows and residents interested in pursuing surgery of the hand. The emphasis will be on cadaver in sections for local, regional and free tissue transfer procedures that are tailored for the upper extremity as well as microneural surgery that includes common nerve transfers and brachial plexus approaches. This is an unprecedented opportunity for hand and microsurgery fellows and residents to be exposed to the details and nuances of these procedures using fresh cadavers and taught by premier hand and microvascular surgeons from across the United States.

Curriculum to include:

Local and intrinsic flaps of the hand

FDMA, Moberg, heterodigital, homodigital, dorsal phalangeal

Pedicled and free flaps of the forearm and upper arm

radial forearm, reverse radial forearm, posterior interosseous, ulnar artery perforator, lateral arm

Distant flaps

latissimus/circumflex system, serratus anterior, scapular/parascapular, ALT/lateral femoral circumflex system, groin flap, gracilis, peroneal artery perforator

Bone flaps

medial femoral condyle, fibula, toe transfer

Functional muscle transfer and inset

latissimus, pectoralis major, gracilis

Brachial plexus approaches

supraclavicular, infraclavicular

Nerve transfers

spinal accessory to suprascapular, Oberlin's, triceps to axillary, distal AIN to ulnar motor
