

HOW TO PREPARE FOR YOUR Kidney Transplant Evaluation Appointment

Kidney transplantation begins with an evaluation appointment that includes conversations with a transplant nephrologist, a transplant nurse coordinator, a transplant dietitian, a transplant social worker, and a transplant pharmacist. To help you prepare for your meeting with the kidney transplant team, here are some sample questions that each kidney transplant team member will ask.
